- 1. Students may complete up to a Maximum of 42 credits at the 1000 level.
- 2. Students must complete a Minimum of 48 credits at 3000/4000 level
- 3. 45 credits of English as listed above.

- 4. Students majoring in English will complete a minimum of 30 credits of English courses at the 3000 and 4000 levels, including the capstone course, ENGL 4760.
- 5. Students with a Major in English must also complete the University's General Education Requirements (ILOs).
