### B) Cplul'kw'ten

Affectionately also referred to as "House 5" or "The Gathering Place", this space is intended as a home away from home for Indigenous students, but all are welcome. Cplul'kw'ten means the Gathering Place in Secwepemctsin. The word was brought to TRU by Bonaparte Elders.



We are the BC Centre for Open Learning. Open Learning has been offering distance education for more than 40 years. Students can obtain certificates, diplomas, undergraduate and graduate degrees, and postbaccalaureate credentials through Open Learning.



The Tournament Capital Centre (TCC) is owned and operated by the City of Kamloops. As a TRU student, you get a discount on a Full Access pass to the TCC including the gym, high performance training centre, indoor track, and outdoor track. All students swim for free!

NPH is home to TRU's Bachelor of Science in Nursing, Master of Nursing and Health Care Assistant programs. This building features four high tech simulation labs equipped with computerized mannequins, hospital and home-visit lab space, classrooms, and student lounges.



East Village is located off-campus and includes apartment-style housing. These dorms have either a twobedroom or four-bedroom suite. East Village is a short walk from many grocery stores and restaurants.



Coyote Den is our newest residence, located off-campus beside East Village. This residence offers both individual and shared rooms, all equipped with a kitchenette and private washroom.


